

Important Information For Persons Moving Household Goods

Non-Allowable Perishable Items

Food items will not be allowed for transport. This is because the food won't survive the move and result in foods becoming spoiled once they arrive at your new home. Loading perishable foods onto a moving vehicle could also attract rats and other pests that might damage your property. Perishable items include those listed below.

Perishable Items – Food, Plants or Living things that may die or spoil in transit*

Perishable/Open Food Products	Frozen/Refrigerated Food
Live Plants including indoor	Opened Containers / Food in jar
Produce	Wine

**For shipments moving less than 150 miles and delivered within 24 hours of pickup, perishable items maybe allowed to be transported as long as they are properly packed and require no servicing in transit.*

Note: Empty your refrigerators and freezers and keep appliance doors open for at least 24 hours in advance of loading. This will allow appliances to dry out and prevent the growth of mold.

Non-Allowable Personal or Sentimental Items

Personal or Sentimental items will not be allowed for transport because of the inherent risk of loss or the potential issues if shipment gets delayed. Valuation guidelines will not cover loss of jewelry, furs and currencies. We suggest to take these items with you. Some examples of personal or sentimental items are listed below.

Airline tickets	Insurance policies
Auto Title	IRAs, tax records
Car or home keys	Jewelry
Car titles	Keys to furn., safe, home
Cash	Laptop computers
CDs	Medical, dental records
Cell phones	Medicine
Certificates of Deposit	New home document
Checkbooks	Personal video tapes, DVDs
Collections (coin, stamp, etc.)	Professional files / Personal papers
Currencies	Research projects
Deeds, Wills, etc.	School records
Evidence of Dept	Sterling silver
Family photos, photo albums	Stocks or bonds
Financial documents	Wedding albums
